I have not invested a lot of time into this, as I just wanted something that worked without having to invest too much into the system.

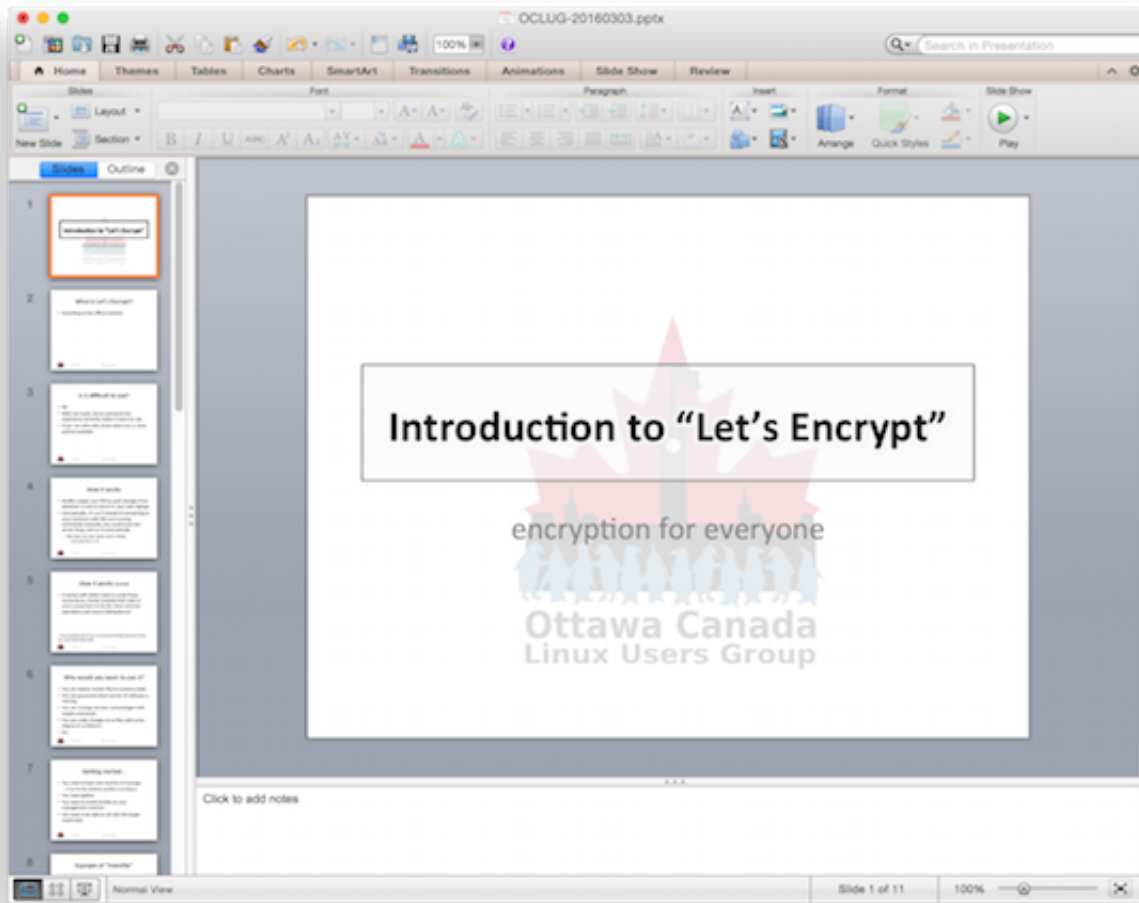
Other Tools
